

VI. STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The goal of every child should be that of a “model student.” A model student is expected to be present at school each and every day, attend class as scheduled, arrive at school and class(es) on time, and demonstrate appropriate behavior and a readiness to learn.

For the My School Online (MSO) Model:

- Log into live sessions with their teachers, on time, each and every scheduled school day.
- Attend online classes as scheduled.
- Enable the camera function on their computers so that the teacher can identify them and take attendance

For the Traditional Schoolhouse Model:

- Be physically present at school, on time, each and every day.
- Attend class as scheduled, on time

Course Make-up

- Request the make-up assignments for all excused absences/tardiness from teachers upon return to school or class.
- Complete the make-up assignments. Failure to make-up assignments can result in lower assessment of the student's academic and/or effort grade.
- Be reported as present for the school day in order to participate in athletic and extracurricular activities.

Although teachers are not required to provide make-up work for the unexcused student absences/tardiness, the Attendance Review Committee may assign educationally related activities to mitigate the loss of instructional time.

VII. PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The parent shall be responsible for their child's school attendance as required by law and stress the importance of regular and punctual school attendance with their child. Board Policy [5200](#) - Attendance, states that "absences shall be reported to the school attendance office by the parent or adult student as soon as practicable. The Superintendent shall require, from the parent of each student of compulsory school age or from an adult student who has been absent from school or from class for any reason, a statement of the cause for such absence. The District reserves the right to verify such statements and to investigate the cause of each single absence.

Parents are expected to:

- Report and explain an absence or tardiness to the school.
- Failure of the parent to provide required documentation within five (5) days upon the student's return to school will result in an unexcused absence.
- Ensure that the child has requested and completes make-up assignments for all excused absences/tardiness from their teachers upon their return to school or class.
- Appear before the Attendance Review Committee at the scheduled time to provide information relating to their child's absences and to support prescribed activities.

Every effort needs to be made by the student, parent, and school administration to avoid absences related to technical difficulties such as the lack of reliable connectivity or device accessibility.

Course Make-up

Make-up assignments for all excused absences/tardiness should be requested upon student returned to school or class. It should be noted that all course work, due to the nature of instruction, is not readily subject to make-up work. The student shall make-up work for excused absences within a reasonable amount of time.

Although teachers are not required to provide make-up work for the unexcused student absences/tardiness, the Attendance Review Committee may assign educationally related activities to mitigate the loss of instructional time.
